

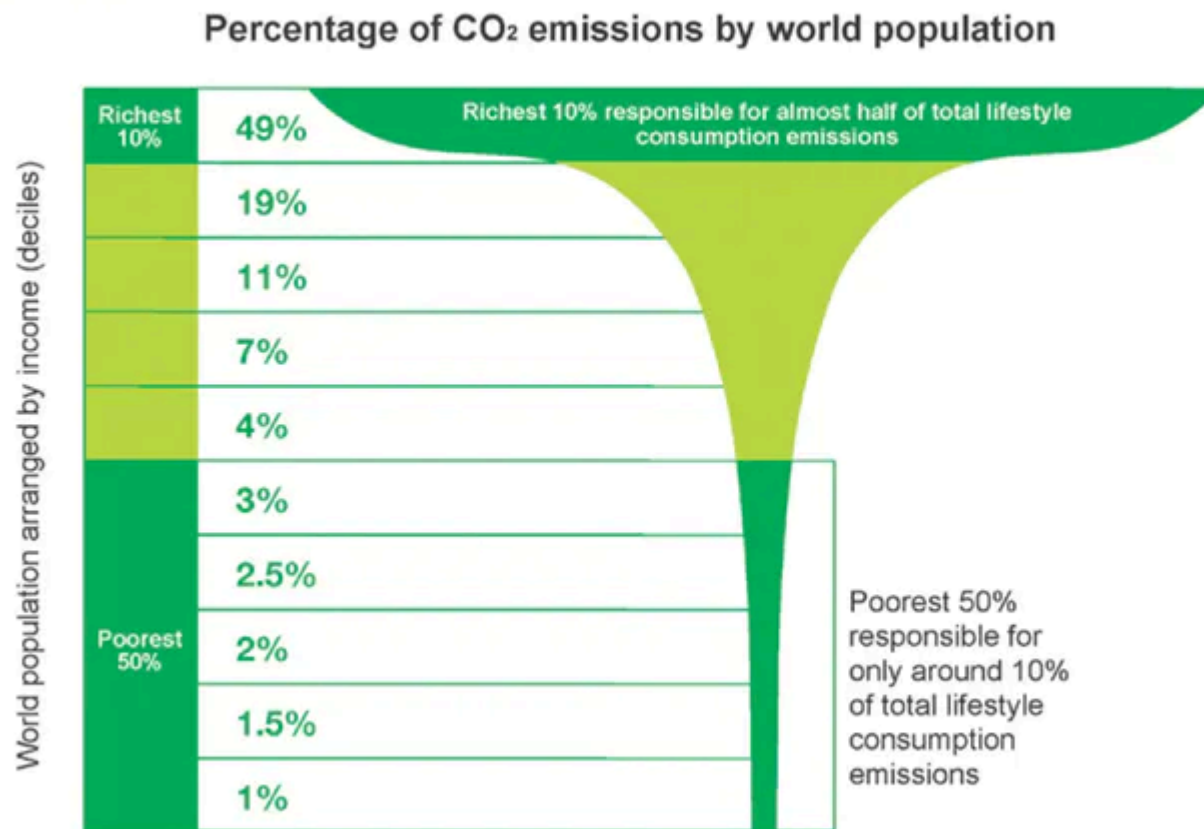
Inequality of impacts

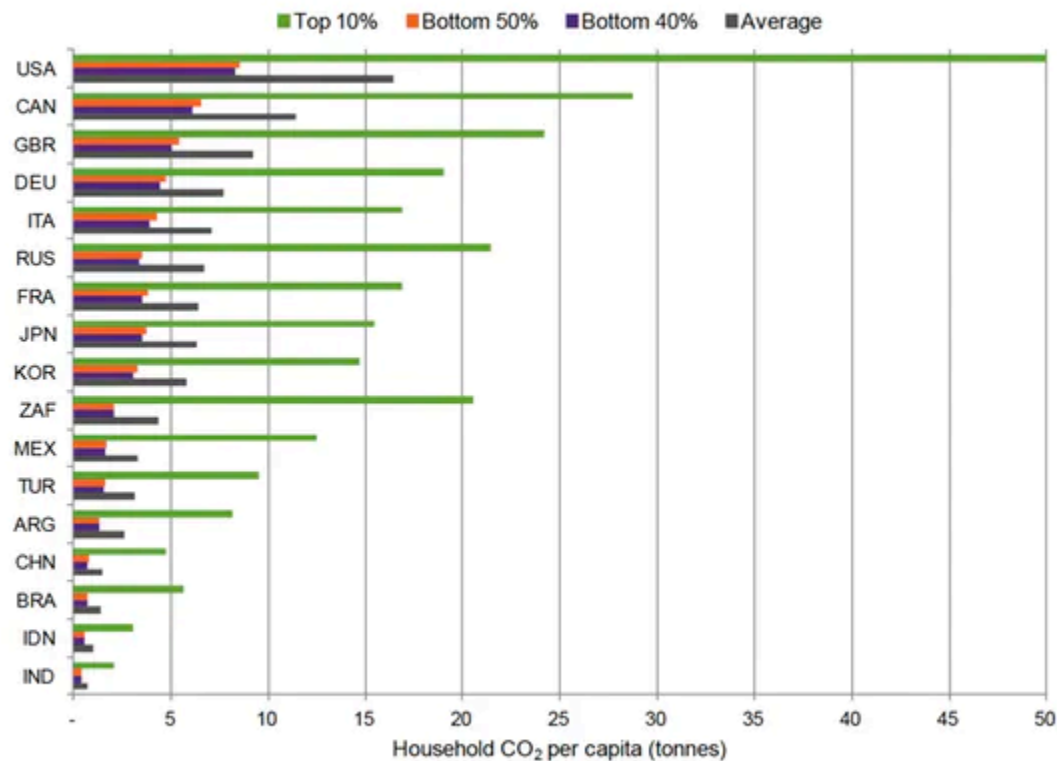
Inequality of emissions

Figure 1: Global income deciles and associated lifestyle consumption emissions



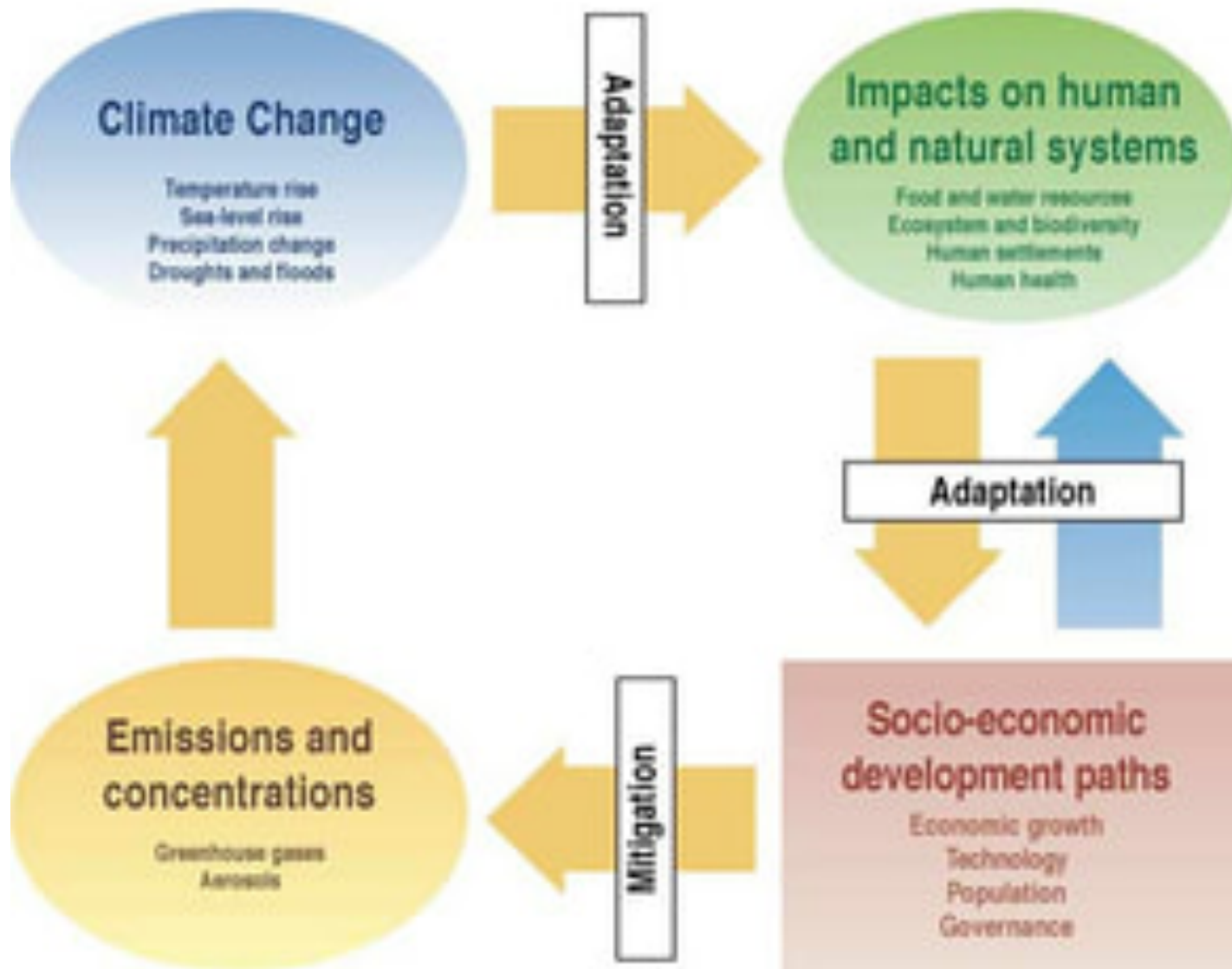
