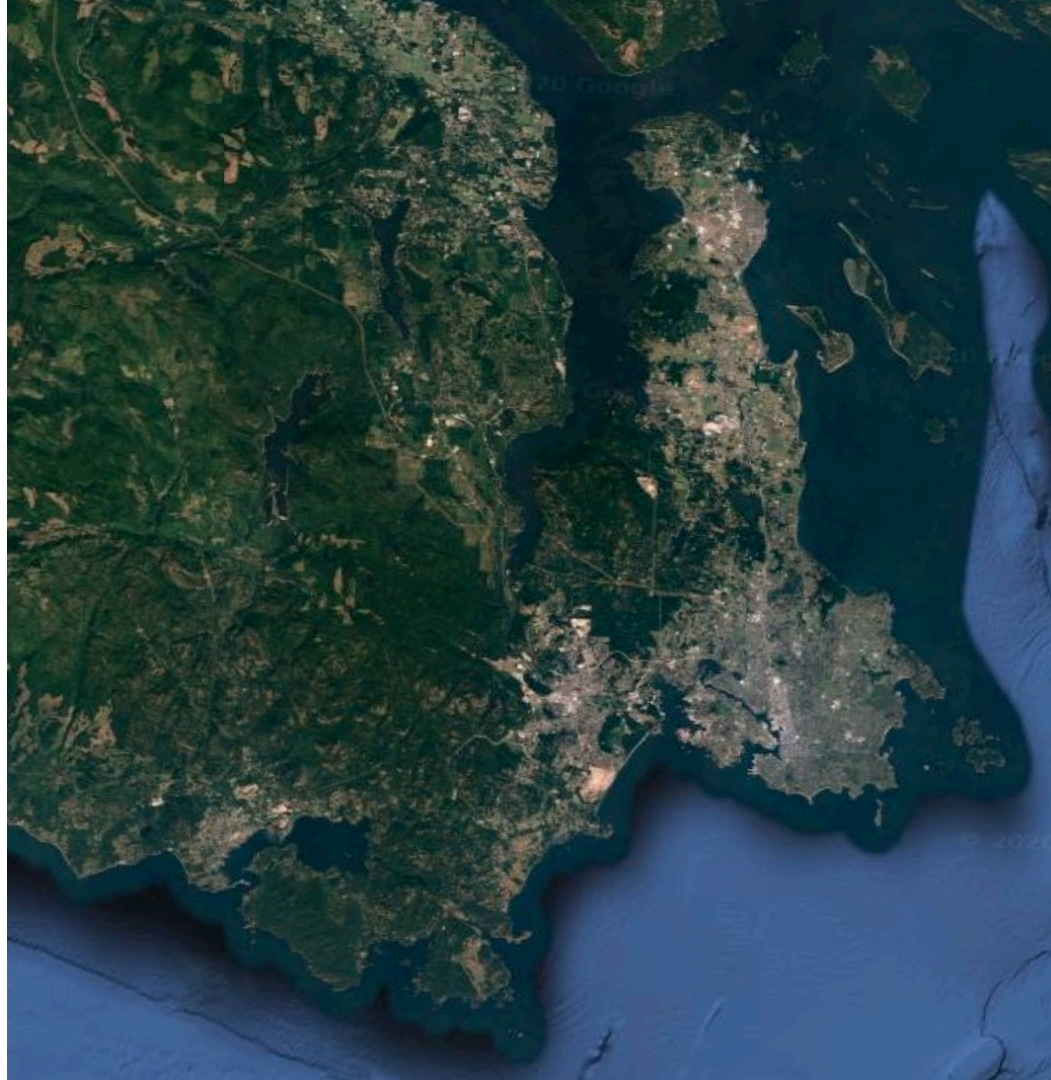

Context - affordability

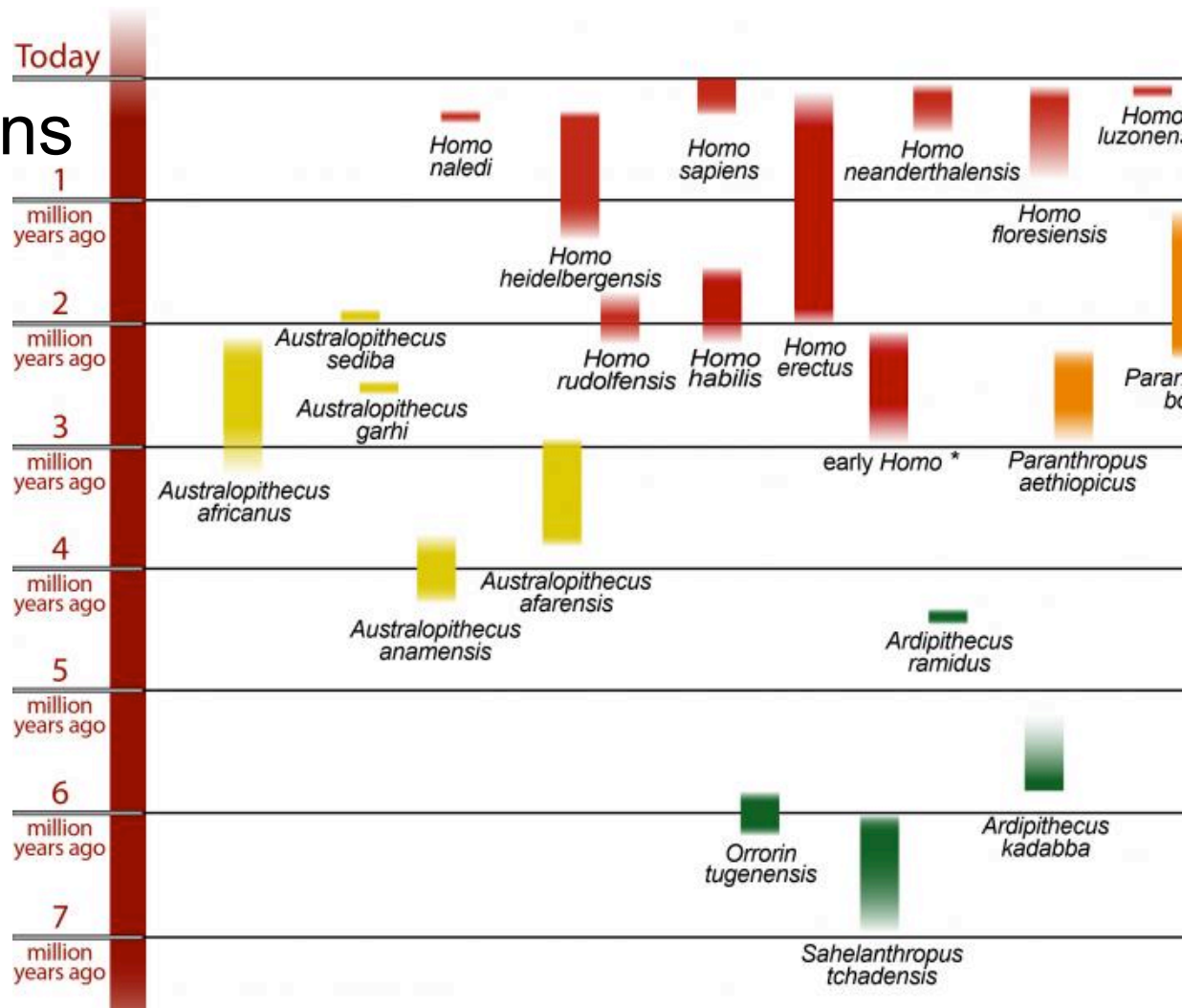


Average housing prices would have to drop by \$413,000 or average salaries would have to more than double for Victoria to become affordable. (Black Press File).

Average housing prices

Alternatively, salaries need to increase to \$134,000 per year, more than double current levels

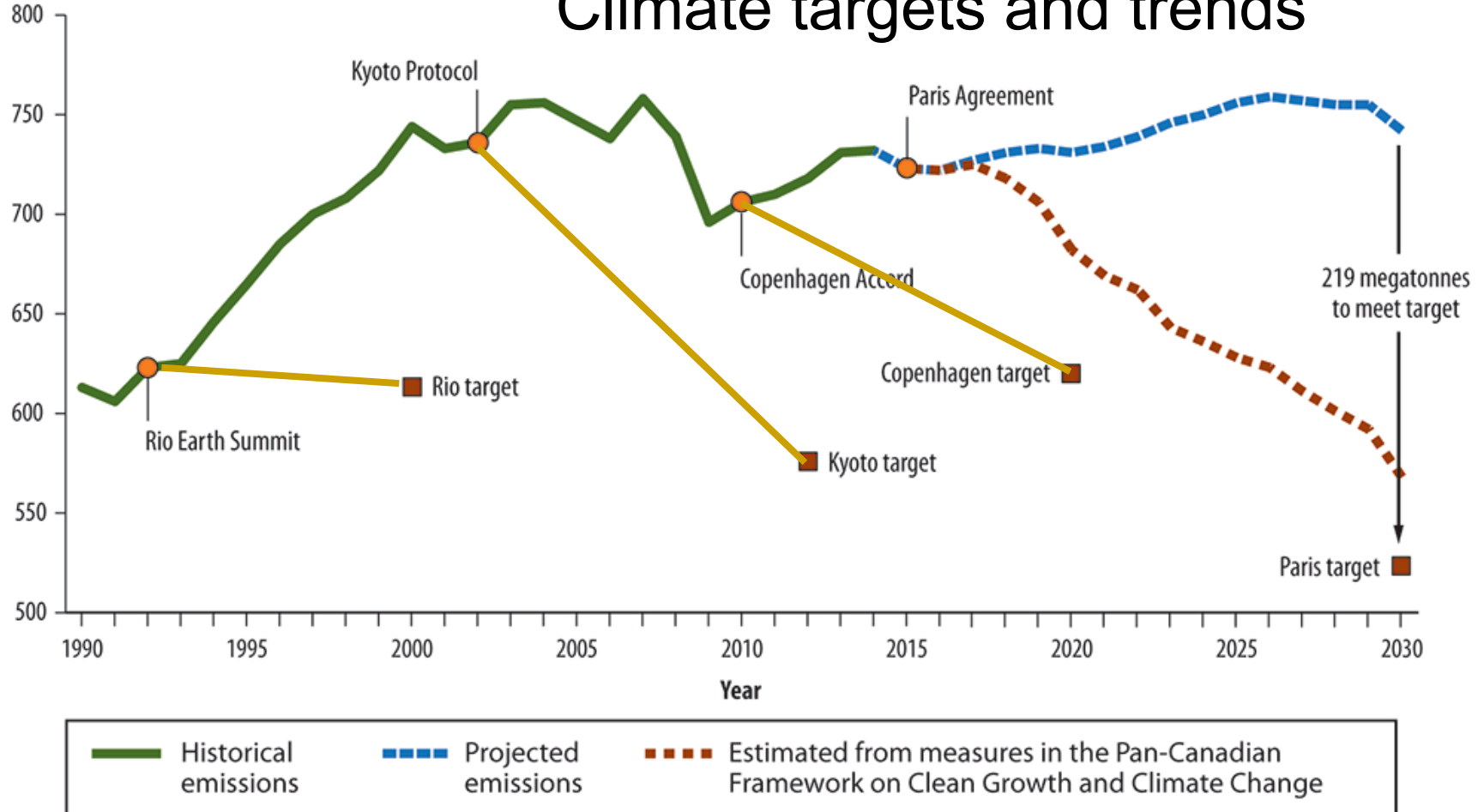

This region: a beacon of hope to North America

Climate

- Normal prescription: “electrify everything and clean up the grid”
- (Omits energy efficiency)
- We are half-way there. Grid is already clean.

Affordability

- Costs are high, but not Vancouver or Toronto high
- Can provide affordable housing with the stroke of a pen

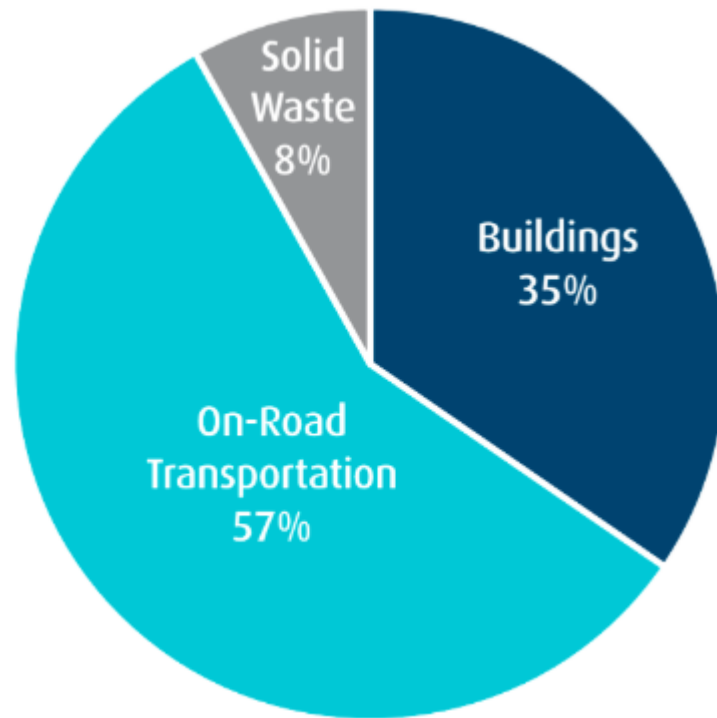
Affordability, location and automobile dependency

- Sticker price affordability: “Drive until you qualify”
 - Start downtown, drive out through suburbs until you can afford the mortgage
- A distant, automobile-dependent home costs more than sticker price
 - ~ \$10,000 per year for each average car
 - ~ \$250,000 over period of typical 25-year home mortgage, per car
 - ~ \$500,000 for two cars
- Distant suburbs are not very affordable
- True affordability means living closer to the core

Climate change and transportation

Regional GHG emissions

- Transport is the largest
- That's just the tailpipe emissions
- Lifecycle (cradle to grave) higher



Zoning bylaws

- Some good - separation of industry and homes
- But... exclusion
- Reduce supply of housing
- Raise prices
- Cause sprawl
- Cause GHG emissions

How? R1-G example

R1-G zoning bylaw

- Limits on uses - single family (no duplex, triplex)
- Minimum lot area
- Minimum lot width
- Setback requirements (front, back and side yards)
- Height restriction
- Parking requirement
- Floor space to lot ratio
- Floor area limits - depends
- Site coverage maximum - 30 percent. I.e. 70% uninhabitable. Plus roads.

No more than two garage sales per year - not even kidding.

Zoning is not a natural, pre-ordained, order of things

It was added in the early 20th century.

Vannes, France couldn't have developed with these rules.



Changes are possible

Cities and higher-level governments have relaxed the rules:

- Victoria allowed secondary suites, though not duplex, triplex, etc.
- Minneapolis: allowed triplexes and removed parking requirements
- Oregon: allowed duplexes in cities > 10,000 , multiplexes >25,000.
- Potential: California, Maryland, Virginia, Austin

How to make change - the variations and solos

- City Council - stroke of a pen.
- Amend zoning bylaws.
- What needed?
- Votes or dollars.
- Votes.

How to make change

- Organize
 - Forming community groups - there are many forming
 - Encouraging community groups to address zoning
- Advocate
 - Letters to editor
 - Op-eds
 - Social media activity
 - Speaking to councillors
 - Speaking to council and writing
 - Speaking to staff and writing
